

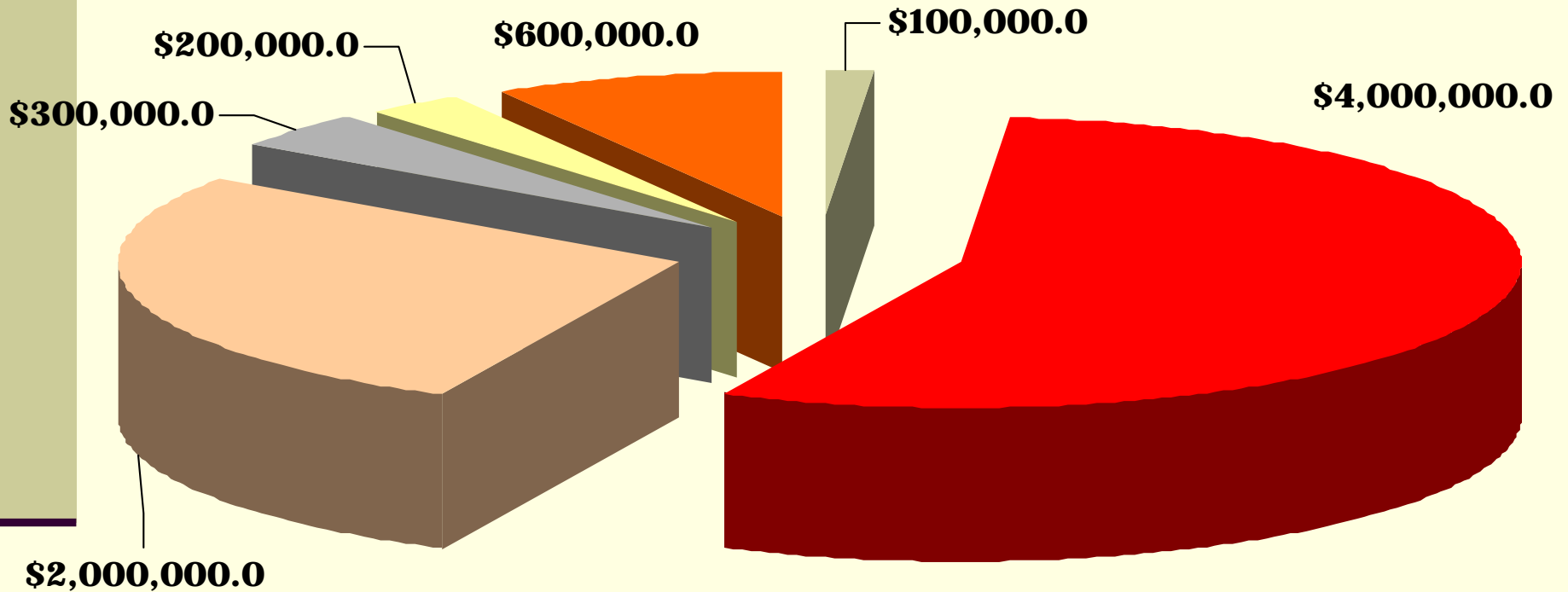

Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (SRF)

SRFs create a perpetual source of state funding for drinking water and wastewater infrastructure.

ARRA Funding

- \$4 billion for Clean Water allotted based on statutory formula
- \$2 billion for Drinking Water allotted based on proportional share of national need
- EPA Region 8 expects to receive \$5-7M

Since 1987 State Clean Water and Drinking Water SRFs have provided more than \$84 billion for 30,000 projects



SRF Provisions



GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Preference for projects that can be started and completed quickly
- 50% used for “additional subsidization” in the form of principal forgiveness, negative interest rates, or grants
- 20% of funds must be used for green infrastructure, water efficiency, energy efficiency, or environmentally innovative projects
- Projects must be on state revolving fund priority list.

Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) Program

- \$200M nationally for cleanup of petroleum leaks and spills from underground storage tanks.
- Funding will mostly go to states; some funding will be used directly by EPA in Indian country. Montana will receive ~\$1.3M.
- No cost share.



National Clean Diesel Campaign

- \$300M nationally in grants to governments and non-profits for projects that reduce diesel emissions.
- National Clean Diesel Funding Assistance Program grants, closes April 28 (~\$156M)
- SmartWay Clean Diesel Finance Program grants, closes April 28 (~\$30M)
- Clean Diesel Emerging Technologies Program grants, closes May 5 (~\$20M)
- State program grants ~\$1.73M/state

Superfund Hazardous Waste Cleanup Program

- \$600M for cleanup of Superfund sites nationally.
- Goal is to start long-term cleanup projects and increase the pace of cleanups of National Priority List Superfund sites.
- 10% cost share for states.



Brownfields Program

- \$100M nationally in competitive grants.
- Includes environmental assessment, cleanup, revolving loan fund and job training grants.
- 20% cost-share for cleanup and RLF grants waived.
- Additional funding for targeted brownfields assessments to be conducted by EPA.
